

Pastor's Letter

This beautiful Epiphany feast always holds a unique place for me and my family, especially when the date for it was fixed on January 6, the “Twelfth Day of Christmas.” That was my beloved mom’s birthday. Added in the fact that my mother spent her early years in the Epiphany parish located in South Philadelphia. Now that the Epiphany is celebrated on a Sunday the date is flexible. But this was a good change, because the feast was often lost to churchgoers when it fell on a weekday. The event deserves our full attention because of its significance.

What it celebrates is captured in the very word “Epiphany” itself. It means a “manifestation” or “showing.” It is the showing of Christ to the wider Gentile world beyond the world of the Jews. It implies His embrace of the same.

Up until now, we note that Christ came into the Jewish world. Both His earthly parents were good Jews, as were His grandparents and His whole extended family. St. Matthew, writing for Jewish converts to the faith, wanted to let them know that Christ came to embrace the whole world, and not just one nation.

So, for today, we can meditate and learn about “the wideness of God’s mercy.” His divine plan for the salvation of the world does not involve exclusions. Still, the perennial questions arise: “Who or what is at the center of our lives? Is it really Christ Jesus or not?” Here is a selection from the texts for today’s feast found at St. Paul’s Episcopal Cathedral in London:

The Magi

It might have been just someone else’s story;
Some chosen people get a special king,
We leave them to their own peculiar glory,
We don’t belong, it doesn’t mean a thing.
But when these three arrive they bring us with them,
Gentiles like us, their wisdom might be ours;
A steady step that finds an inner rhythm,
A pilgrim’s eye that sees beyond the stars.
They did not know his name but still they sought him
They came from elsewhere but still they found;
In palaces they found those who sold and bought him,
But in the filthy stable, hallowed ground.
Their courage gives our questing hearts a voice
To seek, to find, to worship, to rejoice.

New Hampshire Catholic Appeal



The Epiphany and the Gift of the Magi

Isaiah, in prophesying about Jerusalem, refers to Christ and His Church to which those who seek the true light turn their thoughts and their steps. Let us pray for those who grope in the darkness of error and for those who seek true peace.

Saint Paul explains that the prophesy of Isaiah is realized in Christ, the true Light of the World. Saint Matthew tells us about the Magi rendering their homage to Jesus Christ. They offer gold, for they know Him to be a king; myrrh, because they venerate Him as a man; and frankincense because they adore Him as God. Let us offer to Jesus the gold of our charity, the incense of our prayers, and the myrrh of self mortification.

The Magi came a long distance and it is believed that they limit themselves to a brief visit. Where they are from represents many different nations, races, and creeds who are called to be the one children of God. All are invited to the friendship of God, and as one, we can be a world of peaceful co-existence. Filled with very special graces, they must have been overwhelmed by love and reverence in the presence of the divine Infant.

What shall we offer Jesus? Man can offer God nothing which does not already belong to God. Man is nothing. We can offer nothing of our own except our liberty which God gave us to administer, so to speak. We are free, in a way; this is perfection because by it we can manifest our love for God. At the same time, we always have the unfortunate possibility of doing wrong. We have our freedom; we are its administrators. We give the Lord the gift of ourselves, warts and all, and He accepts us for who we are because of His great love for us. We are a gift to the Lord who will never reject us, but cherish us. Let us offer our freedom to the Lord.


